## Lenten Soup Recipes

### Kitchen Cupboard Soup

*Yields:* 6 servings

#### Ingredients

1 can dark kidney beans, drained  
1 can garbanzo beans, drained  
1 can black beans, drained  
Chopped veggies (whatever you have on hand, fresh or canned or frozen)  
1 can Italian-style diced tomatoes, including the liquid  
Seasoning as desired  
Salt and pepper to taste  
Diced garlic clove(s), to taste

#### Preparation

Just throw all the ingredients in the pot and heat through.



### Chicken Soup for the Lenten Soul

*Serves* 10–12 people

#### Ingredients

3 chicken thighs  
2 chicken breasts  
5 cups water  
2 32 ounce cans organic chicken stock  
1 cup onion, chopped  
1 cup of celery, chopped  
3 cloves garlic, minced  
2 14 ounce cans white kidney beans (cannellini)  
1 8–10 ounce bag frozen organic spinach  
seasoned salt (I use Crazy Mixed-Up Salt) to taste



#### Preparation

Cook chicken in water until tender. Remove chicken from broth and pull apart from bones. Return chicken pieces to natural broth and add all the remaining ingredients. Simmer for 1 hour.

I had some requests for the recipe for the pasta dish I brought to the *Concert of Love* Pot Luck. Here it is, for anyone interested: Cook 16 oz pkg. of pasta (wagon wheels or bow-ties work best) in large pot according to package directions; drain and return to pot. Add 2 sticks butter; stir to melt butter. Add 2 lbs. sour cream, 4 c. small-curd cottage cheese, and 8 oz. can mushrooms, drained. *Optional:* add 1 c. shredded Asiago cheese AND/OR 4 c. cut-up cooked chicken. Stir all together, then place in a 13x9 casserole dish. Bake 30 minutes at 350 degrees. Sprinkle with Paprika if desired, for color.

The Session met on February 14<sup>th</sup> and had the pleasure of receiving into membership, Chuck and Sherry Whitcomb. Previously, on January 18<sup>th</sup>, Betty Berry was received in to active membership. This brings our total number of active members to 158, which also reflects removal from the rolls of Rene Mucci and Nicki Augustine, at their request, since they are no longer actively worshipping with us. Average attendance for Sunday morning worship in January was 164.

The Session as a group is reading *Celebration of Discipline* and discussing this chapter-by-chapter at our meetings. We want to grow in Christ and help our congregation to do the same.

Session approved a budget, including proposed Pastor's Terms of Call. The congregation will be asked to vote on the Terms of Call during the Annual Meeting of the Congregation, which is slated for **Sunday, April 2, 2017.**

Pastor Jeff informed us that the September Presbytery meeting is being held at First Presbyterian Church in Vero Beach. We will assist them in preparing for that meeting, and it will be a good opportunity for anyone interested to attend a Presbytery meeting without driving a long distance.

Of note from the Stewardship Team is that they are working with the Presbyterian Foundation to make on-line giving available to members of the congregation. Stay tuned for more information about this new avenue for the church to receive our tithes and offerings.

By going to our web site ([welovefirst.org](http://welovefirst.org)) you will soon find a button (a place to click with your computer) that has to do with giving. If you click that button, you will find options for giving electronically to First Presbyterian of Sebastian.

We can be thankful for electronic giving because:

- You can set up automatic regular drafts from your checking account and be assured of keeping faithful to your giving goals whether you are on vacation, up north, or simply forgetful
- You can make a one-time gift in an easy way from wherever you are
- You can pay with a credit card if that's important to you, again on a one-time basis or a recurring basis
- Some people do not use checks anymore and still want to give to the church

Our electronic giving program is set up by The Presbyterian Foundation and is used by many, many churches across the land.



## Church Math & You! *Do you add up?*

The typical American church loses 10% of its attendance every year due to people moving, becoming too frail to attend, falling out of habit, and death. So if our church was 100 people, one year later it would be 90. Here are just first initials of people who attended FPC a year ago and don’t anymore – G, C, J, B, D, T, D, B, R, A, L, R, N, D, J. That’s 10% and that means we’re normal.

Now the typical American church converts 10% of first time visitors into regular attenders. So if the 100 member church had 2 first time visitors per week (104 total per year), it would supposedly gain 10 attenders. Note, if there are less than 2 per week, that church will get smaller because it isn’t completely making up for its losses.

Every church has to work just to stay even. It has to work harder to grow. *The church is each and every one of us.* What would it look like if each and every one of us invited someone to church for a Lenten Supper?


