Meet Obed & Dyette Molstre, that sunshine-laden couple who shine in our congregation each year from November through March. Down here from Fairbank, Iowa, sunshine is indeed what they seek; what they don't realize is that they bring it with them in their sunny smiles. As Dyette explains, "we are blessed and joyful."

The Molstre's met as ninth graders and have been an item ever since. Similarities surfaced as they grew to know each other in their 7-year courtship. They'd both been adopted into loving families, both recalling happy and wholesome childhoods. When they married, they vowed the same would hold for their own family, and so it was.

After trying his hand at teaching, Ob worked in labor relations for John Deere in Waterloo, IA, for 42 years. He proudly served in the National Guard. Dee Dee was an English teacher for many years, eventually working in a mental health ward – an event she saw as gratifying. They raised 3 children, a girl, Shawna, and 2 boys, Tyler and Gabe, who live with their families in Des Moines. Frequent visits are the Molstre's delight, keeping up with the fun-filled lives of their 5 grandchildren.

Although the Molstre's did not join our church until March 2016, they actually came here for many years when visiting her parents, Howard & Marge Smith, in Barefoot Bay. Both gone now, the Smith's were active members here. Family Christmas gatherings in the Bay were special when the Molstre's made their annual trek from frigid Iowa to balmy Florida. This became a ritual after Shawna's tragic death of cancer at age 17; Christmas celebrations were just easier away from home.

While Ob & Dee Dee were forever changed at the loss of their daughter, amid their sadness grew a deep and lasting peace and a joy that Shawna rests with Our Lord. From her they learned patience and determination and a positive outlook, even on the darkest days of her rigorous treatment. They found strength through Shawna's strength, and marveled at her courage. To this day her spirit remains a "prominent and happy part" of their life; they choose to think of her with joy, not sadness. Two of their granddaughters even carry her name.

This inspiring couple keep busy. An avid golfer, Ob is often walking the links of the Barefoot Bay course. Dee Dee reads a lot and dabbles in poetry, no surprise from this former English schoolmarm. She loves to shop, especially seeking out bargains during their frequent travels. They've explored the Florida East Coast from St. Augustine to Key West and intend to keep on tracking down our State's great travel spots. Favorite trips include Washington, DC and going to Norway with the whole family some years ago. Dyette admits these retired teachers have traded the 3 R's for the 4 F's: "Faith, Family, Friends and Food!"

Ob & Dee Dee love the First Presbyterian Church of Sebastian. Sunday mornings are foremost as they come to hear Pastor Jeff's meaningful messages and heartfelt prayers. They feel the warmth of our church family and freely give it back. Involvement is enjoyed at times like Hanging of the Greens and other group gatherings. The Session held its December Stated Meeting on 12/12/17. We joyfully received Margaret "Maggie" Hall into Active membership by Reaffirmation of Faith. We now have 160 Active members. Also present at the meeting were in-coming Elders from the Class of 2020: Pete Crawford, Susan Coard, and Mary Keogh, and Ron Kelly (currently on Session, serving a second consecutive term). The in-coming elders shared their faith story with us. Current elders submitted questions from the Book of Order for the elder examination, and the new elders will be ordained and/or installed during worship on Sunday, January 7, 2018.

We approved vacation time for Pastor Jeff from 12/31/17 following worship until 1/7/18 prior to worship, so he can enjoy some family time. We decided to contribute the Christmas Eve offering to Make Way Partners, which helps rescue and protect orphans and women in Sudan. We also decided to use funds from the Memorial Fund, primarily from the bequest of Don MacLean, to purchase hurricane shutters to protect the church windows and doors. These will be accordion-type shutters, easy to close and secure when needed.

Of interest from the winter meeting of Central Florida Presbytery is that Christina Greenawalt, who has filled the pulpit for Pastor Jeff twice this year, was hired as the new Administrative Assistant to Dr. Dan Williams, our Executive Presbyter. Sam Spear attended that meeting as our Elder Commissioner and brought back the report...thanks Sam! Finally, we approved the updated Employee Handbook and prayed for a local business, Country Ham & Eggs, and for Pastor Seth Goldsmith and Community Church.




Congratulations to our Graduates!
